
3. Trainer 1 requirements

- increased involvement in school activities
- 1 passport picture
- Course fee of \$175 on sign-up
- entry level for participation SG5

5. Why become a Wing Tsun Trainer?



For some it's only a nice hobby on the side, for others it is a great way to balance job, life, body and mind. Some want to achieve everything that is possible in Wing Tsun, even make a career out of it.

Regardless of the motivation, one usually finds that he/she learns the most by teaching others while continuing one's own learning process.

Becoming a good Wing Tsun trainer is a long process and requires hard work. Becoming a Wing Tsun trainer is a tough responsibility rather than an honour.

A Wing Tsun trainer is not suddenly a unbeatable Wing Tsun fighter, she/he learns more and more in depth, to help others to achieve their goals. Learning how to teach can take many, many years!

Besides the technical qualifications a prospective Wing Tsun Trainer will over the years be able to achieve further Trainer Certifications. Ask about our accelerated student program advancement.

6. Teaching License, Trainer 1 ... What does it mean?

- How does one get this license? In addition to the 'Trainer 1 requirements' listed points your practical Wing Tsun tests will increase in intensity. Other than that you simply have to sign up.
- When is the Trainer 1 License valid?
 This Wing Tsun Trainer License is valid in combination with at least the 10th Student Grade.
- What can one do with this License?
- 1. Possibly open up your own Wing Tsun School, subject to approval.
- 2. You can open up your own Wing Tsun School, yet team up with the Head-Instructor.
- 3. You can take over certain parts of the teaching, or some classes in the school of the Head Instructor, become part of the team.
- 4. Depending on technical grade and type of license, instructor can test certain uneven student grades of his/her students in his/her own Wing Tsun School.



- 5. Getting more involved in our school activities by partially teaching groups of our existing students
- 6. Through teaching, find out more about the student/instructor programs by facing unexpected questions from beginners, facing unusual situations (fast unexpected attacks, etc.), having to know not just the programs, but also the "how to" of teaching them, including motivating others, etc.

The motivation of some is to become good instructors one day. Others just want to improve themselves.

Both will experience that responsible teaching is the best learning tool for oneself!

Point 2 and 3 mentioned above are subject to the approval of the Head-Instructor. As in other schools, many students may achieve their license, but few will only be approved to

actually teach.


Again, rather than an honor or great achievement, a Trainer License is a responsibility.

7. Theory topics for a future Wing Tsun Trainer

The theoretical education goes way beyond the pure understanding of Wing Tsun itself. The instructors and students are expected to subject themselves, to learn about a wide variety of surrounding topics.

Those programs taught in group classes, private lessons, during seminars will over time include the following:

- Wing Tsun techniques, body mechanics, physics
- Wing Tsun strategies and tactics
- How to open a Wing Tsun school
- The history of many different styles/martial arts
- The self-defense laws reflecting the lawful situations depending on the countries specifics
- Programs and teaching of children's classes
- Programs for seniors
- Programs for people with disabilities
- Programs for security firms, bodyguards, special units of police and armed forces
- Nutrition and healthy living
- Special seminars about Japanese and Korean styles under special consideration of Karate and Taekwon-Do
- Special seminars about the thematic of boxing, Thai-boxing and other full contact styles



- Internal Chinese styles, ChiKung and breathing
- External Chinese styles
- How to deal with students, assistants and other instructors
- Public presentation skills for contacts with the press and other styles
- Taoism
- Zen and Chan Buddhism
- Confucianism
- The philosophy behind Wing Tsun
